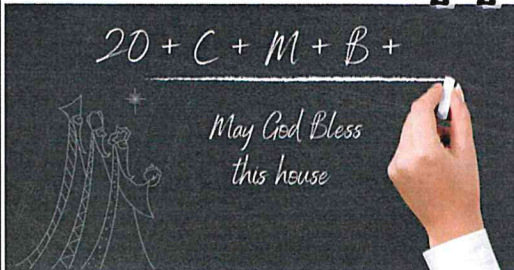

## Epiphany House Blessing



The blessing of homes with prayer and chalk at the feast of the Epiphany is a centuries-old tradition in the church, particularly in Europe, and has begun to spread in the United States. In what has affectionately been called “holy graffiti,” it is an appropriate way of asking Christ to be our daily guest in the New Year, and to bless all our comings and goings.

The marking of homes has roots in the Old Testament, both at Passover and in the following passage from Deut. 6:4-9: “Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. ... [W]rite them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.”

Using chalk, the following mark is made over your front door, the porch entrance, or some other convenient location:  $20 + C + M + B + 24$

Between the numbers of the current “year of our Lord” are a series of crosses—the sign of our salvation—and the letters *C*, *M*, and *B*. The letters have a double meaning. They are reminders of the traditional names of the three wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. And they stand for the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*—“Christ bless this house.”

The blessing may be simple or elaborate. Use the short liturgy below or create your own!

### A Brief Liturgy for the Blessing of a Home at Epiphany

*All gather outside at the entrance of the home. Any member of the family may serve as the Leader of the service.*

**Leader:** The Lord shall watch over your going out and your coming in;

**All:** From this time forth for evermore.

*A psalm or passage of Scripture may be read. Suggestions include: Psalm 121, Psalm 128, Matthew 2:9-12*

*Then, using chalk, a member of the household writes the following over the door or on some other convenient, visible location:*

$20 + C + M + B + 24$

*The Lord's Prayer is then said.*

*The liturgy concludes as follows*

**Leader:** The Lord be with you.

**All:** And also with you.

**Leader:** Let us pray.

O God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Light of the nations and the Glory of your people, bless all who dwell in this house and those who visit. May it be for them a place of peace and health, that they may rejoice in the gifts and graces you have bestowed upon them and dedicate their talents for the good of those for whom your Christ came and gave his life, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

**Amen.**

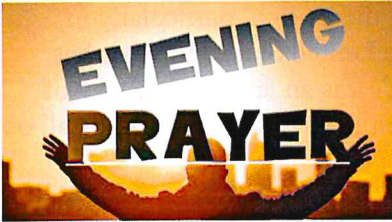

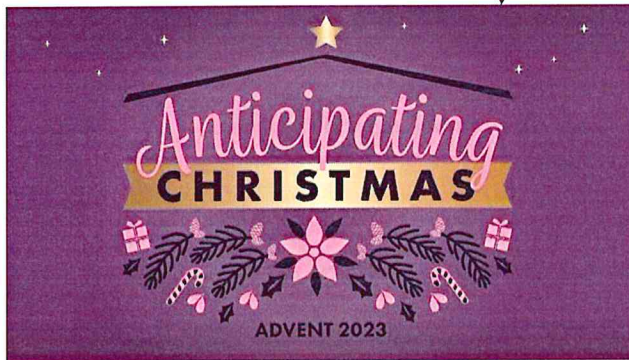

*Evening Prayer*

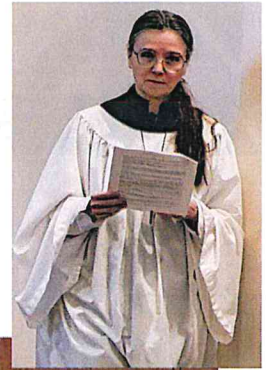

## *Yes, we make house-calls!*

...and hospital calls. Your Order of St Luke (OSL) prayer ministers are blessed to come to homes and hospital rooms to pray with anyone that requests it. Often, the quiet of a home, or even a hospital room can afford the opportunity for more time than we have at Eucharists. We can pray at a comfortable pace, and listen for the Holy Spirit more attentively when we have more time. We've prayed with people before surgeries, while awaiting diagnosis, before and during extended treatments (like chemotherapy). The team has prayed in preparation for chemotherapy for more than five parishioners.

Some common questions:

*Is this limited to St George parishioners?* No, St George members, or clergy can request a visit for folks not members of our congregation. Of course, those folks need to be open to the visit.

*So, how does it work?* A call to Bob Vaughn, the local OSL convener, or to the church office, is all that is needed to get the ball rolling. We will arrange a mutually agreeable time for a small team (two to four) to visit. For hospitals and other care facilities, we will check for limits on the number of visitors. If there is a concern about spreading illness, like a cold, masks can be requested. The team will ask permission to lay hands on the patient. Depending on availability, prayers may be offered in conjunction with Eucharist.

*What can I expect during prayer?* We follow Jesus' example – even when the need is obvious (e.g., the blind man), Jesus often asked what the patient wanted—so we ask what the patient wants prayer for. We then take time to listen in silence for hints from the Holy Spirit to direct our prayer. As they are led, team members take turns offering prayers. Some team members may just pray silently. The patient can add additional requests, or add their own prayers as they are led. If the patient gets uncomfortable, we pause praying until that need can be satisfied. We pray until the Holy Spirit shows we are done...that could be five minutes, or 20 minutes. We conclude by asking God's blessing on the patient.



*Do I need to clean my house, and plan refreshments?* No! We come to serve, not be served. We won't plan to stay long after prayer, so don't plan to entertain.
